- Make a copy of your driver's license, bank and credit card(s), passport or any form of identification to keep in a safe place at home.
- Create a list of the items generally carried in your wallet or purse.
- Park in well-lit areas.
- Lock your car doors regularly check and recheck.
- Use common sense and listen to your gut.
- Contact your local law enforcement agency for additional tips.

## What can you do if you've been a victim?

- If you are the unfortunate victim of vandalism, start by following the below safety tips. These will ensure that both you and your vehicle are protected.
- Contact your local law enforcement agency to determine if a report needs to be filed
- Contact your insurance company if you have additional damage to your vehicle and/ or property loss.
- If your wallet has been stolen, contact your bank to cancel any bank, credit cards and/or checks.
